RE: INTERIM ORDER – CONSECUTIVE ORDER: TERMS AND CONDITIONS ON LICENSE

Dear Mr. Tamula,

On August 31, 2026, the Registrar of the Prince Edward Island College of Physiotherapy (the “College”) wrote to Council to advise them of notice of a criminal conviction against you. The council met on September 2, 2026, and reviewed the notice of criminal conviction from August 27, 2026, and the conviction from 2017.

Council has decided to impose terms and conditions on your physiotherapy registration, in accordance with subsection 53(3) of the Regulated Health Professions Act (the “RHPA”) for 90 days. Further information is required to satisfy and inform the Council of their decision making. Those terms and conditions include:

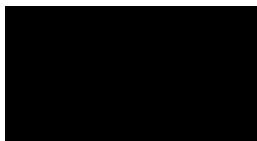
- **No unsupervised patient contact:** The Registrant shall not be alone with a patient at any time while providing or purporting to provide physiotherapy services.
- **Third-party presence:** The Registrant shall provide physiotherapy services only when a third party, who has been approved in advance by the Registrant’s employer and is not the patient, is physically present in the same room and is in a position to directly observe the Registrant’s interactions with the patient.
- **Employer monitoring:** The Registrant shall practice only for an employer that has agreed, in writing, to:
 - a. establish and maintain arrangements ensuring that the Registrant is not alone with a patient;
 - b. monitor the Registrant’s compliance with these terms and conditions; and
 - c. report immediately to the Registrar any actual, suspected, or attempted breach of these terms and conditions.
- **Responsibility for compliance:** The Registrant remains personally responsible for compliance with these terms and conditions and shall not provide physiotherapy services if the required third party is absent or unavailable.

Until this order, and any consecutive order, has expired, you Decjuffah Dyson Tamula are required to follow the terms and conditions imposed on your physiotherapy license in the Province of Prince Edward Island. Failure to comply with this Order may result in additional disciplinary action under the RHPA or further legal charges or penalties, or both. Each of these carries significant consequences. This Order comes into effect once you have received a copy and will be in place for 90 days. The Council may make consecutive orders until a resolution of the situation has been reached.

Notice of the terms and conditions on your physiotherapy license will be made public and listed on the College website.

As per subsection 59(2)(a) of the RHPA, you have the right to appeal Council's decision to the Supreme Court of Prince Edward Island within 30 days of receiving this Order.
