### **PEICPT Renewal**

Thank you to all members that completed the renewal process. We currently have 128 members with 12 of those members being PT Residents. A reminder going into 2023 for Continuing Education hours:

- PT Residents do NOT require CE for renewal
- PTs on the general registration with <3 years of PEICPT membership 10 CE hours per year
- PTs on the general registration with >3 years of PEICPT membership 30 CE hours over the last 3 years.

# **Canada Winter Games Volunteers**

As much of the Island prepares for the 2023 Canada Winter Games on PEI this winter, we are doing the same at the PEICPT. If you are aware of any PT colleagues that intend to travel to the Island to volunteer as a physiotherapist, please ask them to contact the College in January to ensure they have adequate time to obtain their temporary/special license.

This is a good reminder that if you intend to travel out of province to provide physiotherapy, you should investigate ahead of time what each province/territory requires. This could be for sports coverage, continuing education, etc. Most will charge \$25-75, they will require proof of your liability insurance and a letter of good standing (some provinces call this a Regulatory History form). It can take up to a week to be processed. I have had some panic emails/texts, requesting documents to be completed and signed off on, as members were unaware of this requirement!
